### Autumn Trip to Auckland Castle, Spanish Gallery & Garden



The Auckland Project is a regeneration charity with a difference, and has Auckland Castle as one of the best-preserved bishops' palaces in the whole of Europe, at its centre. It has recently undergone major conservation work which has transformed its state rooms, including the magnificent Throne Room, back to their original Georgian Gothic splendour, fit for the Prince Bishops, as designed by the architect James Wyatt. In the Long Dining Room there is also one of the largest collections of paintings by the Spanish artist Francisco de Zurbaran (1598–1664). In addition, you can visit St Peter's Chapel, one of the largest private chapels in Europe.

Within walking distance of the Castle is the new Spanish Gallery, which houses the UK's largest collection of 16th and 17th century Spanish artworks outside London including work by El Greco, Murillo and Velazquez. The inaugural exhibition includes El Greco's remarkable Christ on the Cross. The Gallery was formally opened earlier last year by HM Queen Letizia of Spain and, as he was then, HRH Charles Prince of Wales.

During the conservation work that has been carried out at both the Castle and the Spanish Gallery, access for the less abled has been considered, and lifts to the different floors are available if required. The Castle Gardens are another delightful attraction and provide a lovely setting to wander through or sit and relax.



Further details for this trip, which is likely to take place in early September, will follow, once arrangements have been finalised, but this promises to be an excellent day out. We do hope many of you will join us.
